

Workers are needed for school jobs

BROOKFIELD Multiplex will carry out infrastructure projects at 189 public schools in western Sydney and is now seeking employees to complete the work.

The developer has teamed with The Salvation Army Employment Plus (TSAEP) and is encouraging indigenous people and the long-term unemployed to take advantage of the job opportunities created.

The work forms part of the Federal Government's Building Education Revolution program.

TSAEP spokeswoman Kirrilee Trist said it had already filled more than a dozen positions and was seeking another 40 applicants, including indigenous job seekers.

"This socially inclusive employment program not only involves Brookfield Multiplex staff but will spread to its local suppliers and subcontractors, and will range from office work to construction positions," Ms Trist said.

"We aim to ensure that disadvantaged job seekers and those made redundant due to the economic downturn receive the maximum support so they can access these job opportunities."

She said the jobs would allow people to learn new trades and skills.
