

Work continues on Carlton Parade Cemetery upgrade

Work is continuing on an upgrade of the Carlton Parade Cemetery, which will make it easier for visitors to navigate through the cemetery and to find graves.

A team from the Salvation Army Employment Plus program have built cement borders around a third of the graves in the cemetery.

The Port Augusta Council is now asking the families of those buried in the cemetery to pay the \$85 cost of name plaques to be mounted on the new concrete borders.

Work on this five-stage project will continue until next March and will also include basic repairs on the graves vandalised in June.

Currently the Salvation Army workers are splitting their time between cementing borders and beautification of the grounds.

Cemetery upgrade grows

A CEMETERY upgrade at Port Augusta has been expanded.

The five-stage upgrade to Carlton Parade Cemetery, which began in 2007, is being jointly funded by Port Augusta Council and Salvation Army Employment Plus.

It is also a Work for the Dole project.

The upgrade is in its third stage, and has been expanded to include cementing borders.
